CONSTRUCTION

Course Outline

The construction industry also plays a key role in achieving the Scottish Government's ambitious housing, energy, and climate change targets.

This course is an ideal starting point for you to explore each of the main trade areas. This is a very practical course on it you will work in a variety of workshops. You will cover trade areas as well as underpinning theoretical work. Alongside learning new skills, you will also work towards developing core skills such as communications, numeracy, working with others and problem solving, all of which are invaluable when entering the world of work.

Entry Level Recommended

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.

Course Content

In this course, you'll have the opportunity to get started in the basics of construction. This could cover carpentry and joinery, brickwork or painting and decorating. You'll acquire a range of practical skills and unleash your creative potential in the field of construction.

Progression

On completion of this course, you can progress onto senior phase Construction Crafts. Following successful completion of the course you will also be eligible to apply for a range of full-time college courses such as Pre-Apprenticeships L5 in Carpentry and Joinery, Painting and Decorating, Roofing and Bricklaying as well as Electrical Installation, Insulation and Sustainable Heating and more.

Graduates from West have gone on to a range of trade roles including plumbers, electricians, joiners, painting and decorators and more.

PLUMBING

Course Outline

Working in the plumbing industry offers a wide range of roles from fitting and repairing water and heating systems to air conditioning, gas, and renewable energies.

This course gets you started with the basics based around the practical activities in the plumbing industry. You will be learning about key plumbing tools and hand skills necessary for any plumber or plumbing apprentice. The course focuses on cutting, fitting, connecting, and assembling copper pipework.

A perfect introduction to the industry aimed at individuals wishing to progress into further training or employment.

Entry Level Recommended

No formal entry requirements but a keen interest in plumbing and renewable technologies.

Course Content

Get hands-on fabricating practical copper pipework arrangements. You'll get to grips with the use of plumbing tools and materials needed to excel on site and get your hands dirty with a live college project, providing practical experience for the world of work. Great for your CV!

Progression

You can progress onto Pre-Apprenticeship Plumbing and Renewable Technologies or pursue an apprenticeship within the industry.

INTRODUCTION TO ENGINEERING (ENGINEERING UNITS)

Course Outline

Scotland's engineering and advanced manufacturing sector contributes £9 billion a year to the nation's economy. Careers in Engineering are on the rise and these jobs represent an exciting opportunity for young people in Scotland.

In this Introduction to Engineering course, you will study a series of units in mechanical and electrical engineering. These units will give you knowledge in engineering and its technologies used within a practical workshop environment. The course will have both a practical and a theoretical element. For the practical element you will be required to manufacture, assemble and wire artefacts to an agreed standard. For the theoretical element you will be required to answer written questions.

Entry Level Recommended

S4 students working towards Nat 4/5 preferably in either maths, technology or science subjects.

Course Content

The course is comprised of units designed to substantially improve your practical skills by manufacturing a number of different items from a series of engineering drawings to within a given tolerance.

- Engineering Skills: Mechanical and Fabrication
- Engineering Skills: Electrical and Electronic
- Engineering Skills: Maintenance

Progression

You can progress onto Skills for Work Engineering course upon completion. This will expand upon the knowledge gained and cover the subjects in more depth. Longer term (S6) you would be progressing to the Foundation Apprenticeship. This course has great success of student employment in a diverse range of sectors in the engineering industry including design, mechanical, maintenance, electrical, electronics, fabrication and manufacture.

How do I get there?

If transport is required, this is organised through your school and will take you back to the nearest point to your home at the end of the day.

How are the vocational course options different from the subjects that I take at school?

The main difference is that with vocational course options there is a strong focus on building skills for life and skills for work. The vocational courses lead to awards such as Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs), City and Guilds (C&G) and Higher National Certificates HNC.

How will the courses be certified?

When you receive your certificate from the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) and City and Guilds, the results of your vocational courses will appear alongside the awards for courses you have completed in school.

So what are the benefits?

Whether your next step is into the workplace, starting on your apprenticeship journey, or progressing to further study at college or

university, this qualification will help you make that next big move. As well as your qualification, you'll gain essential skills like communication, teamwork, and problem-solving—tools that will set you apart and help you excel in the dynamic world of work. You'll also get the chance to experience learning outside the school classroom, getting a taste for college life and a different style of learning from our award-winning lecturing team.
